Skills Development Scotland

Your SDS Careers Service doesn't stop when you leave school. If you need help to develop your career management skills, build your strengths for a CV, find opportunities, apply for jobs and prepare for interviews, you can work with an SDS Work Coach or Post School Career Coach. We can help you on the phone or if that's not possible in Dunfermline and Kirkcaldy Careers centre.





Fife College Employability Hub

The Student Employability team will ensure your career development is an integral part of your time at Fife College. In additional to identifying and learning the skills and qualities which are embedded into your course, the team will advise on how to research, apply, and be successful with your career opportunity of choice.





Access to Industry & Metaskills (AIMS)

AIMS Net Zero, AIMS Social Services, Healthcare and Children and Young People could be your first step to employment. You will gain an industry-recognised qualification and accelerate your progression into future employment.



Young Person's Guarantee Opportunity Finder

The Young Person's Guarantee is a commitment to bring together employers, partners and young people. It aims to connect every 16 to 24 year old in Scotland to an opportunity. This could be a job, apprenticeship, further or higher education, training or volunteering.



Apprenticeship Family

Modern and Graduate Apprenticesips combine a qualification with on-the-job experience. This allows you to work, learn and earn at the same time.

Hand Picked is a unique employer sponsorship programme, which supports young people into employment. It is driven by a network of Scotland's business owners and employers who understand today's labour market and who are committed to nurturing Scotland's future workforce.





Skills Boost Courses

These free, short-term, online, flexible Skills Boost courses are an ideal way to both refine your core skills and to learn new skills for specific industry sectors.







Fife Employment Access Trust

Fife Employment Access Trust deliver services to enable people who have challenges with their mental health to progress along the employability pathway including helping them get into paid sustainable employment.





16+ Learning Choices

Within Opportunities for All, 16+ Learning Choices is a Scottish Government approach to ensure that all young people have an 'offer' of formal learning post 16 i.e. continuing in school, further education, higher education, government training programmes, employment and volunteering.











Employability Access Support for Young People

EASYP is a funded transition programme for 16 to 18-year-olds that offers employability support as they leave education.

Fife Council's Supported Employment Service, teamed with Education Service and Communities & Neighbourhoods, supports young people with varying barriers to employment including those who may be disengaged from education, or have a disability, health condition, living in poverty, lack of work experience, lone parents and caring responsibilities.







Bright Futures

Bright Futures offers provision for all unemployed 19-24 year olds across Fife. We provide a variety of engaging provision, supporting young people on their journey towards sustainable employment. Bright Futures offers 1:1 keyworker support, a variety of programme activities, work tasters, work trials, sectorbased work academies and unique job brokerage support. We aim to ensure those who experience complex and multiple barriers to moving into work are not "left behind", whilst also focussing on the goals and aspirations of the young person, ensuring they are at the centre of all decisions.







Prince's Trust

Through an online casework approach supporting a face-to-face employability programme, this project will support young people to gain work experience and expand their personal and social development skills to progress into a positive destination including engagement with The Prince's Trust Get Into programme.







Venture Trust

The Inspiring Young Futures programme (IYF) supports young people facing complex challenges, often with experience of trauma and most having left school with few qualifications, to make positive change and improve prospects through building confidence and problem solving, decision making and communicating skills.











Community Trade Hub

The core aims of the Community Trade Hub is to reduce barriers to employment and provide equal opportunities to all with easy access to practical training, employability and support to those interested in the Construction Trades sector.







LinkLiving's Moving On Up

LinkLiving are launching a new programme for 16-19 year olds, living in Falkirk and Fife. Moving On Up is a two-tiered programme which offers tailored support covering mental health and resilience, and skills for life over a period of up to 52 weeks.









Fife Voluntary Action

Fife Voluntary Action work specifically with young people who face barriers to employment, education or training. They support young people to achieve their goals and gain volunteering experience, as well as build confidence, access training and progress to education or paid employment.

Find a Job is the Department for Work and Pensions free online service to search and apply for full or part time employment. The enhanced search function will enable you to refine your search to jobs in your local area.
